U.S. Tobacco GAP Training

Over 9,000 growers have attended 2015 GAP training across 11 states with more training occurring in various states. Please remember that training after June 30, 2015 will be marked as late on your grower transcript. It will be at the discretion of contracting companies to accept or not accept that late training. If you need training please contact GAP Connections or your local Extension office.

The training this year featured Enhanced Labor Management Training in partnership with the Farm Labor Practices Group and the U.S. Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division (U.S. DOL). Growers were presented with the requirements and best practices on five main topics: payment of labor, disclosure of employment terms, housing, farm labor contractors, and transportation. This was a great opportunity for growers to interact with U.S. DOL officials and ask questions to better understand the laws and regulations they operate under. Transplants and Greenhouse Records Required for GAP Compliance

As transplanting season rolls along, remember that U.S. Tobacco GAP Program standards require that growers keep records of all transplants used in their operation, whether they grow their own plants or buy them from a greenhouse grower. The required information is found in Tab 6 of the 2015 Records packet, distributed to growers at GAP training sessions this winter.



If growers are purchasing transplants, they need to get this information from their greenhouse grower. To make this easier, GAP Connections has created a Purchased Transplant Records Sheet, available here (scroll down to Category:Records). There are two options: (1) a combination form that has the transplant records and CPA records all on one sheet for a particular batch number, or (2) two forms, which separate the transplant records from the CPA records. This would allow a transplant provider (seller) to make copies of his Greenhouse CPA records and provide them to all of his purchasers with the Purchase Transplant Record.

Growers can give this form to their transplant producer, or transplant producers can print the form, record the needed information and give it to growers when they pick up their transplants. The information can also be entered online using the interactive version of the form and emailed to growers or printed and given to them in hard copy. The information on this form includes all of the transplant production records needed to meet GAP requirements.

New Bulletin on Green Tobacco Sickness (Now on GAP Connections App)

A recommended practices bulletin with guidance on reducing the hazards for tobacco workers has been jointly developed by the Occupational Safety and Health <u>Administration</u> and the <u>National Institute for Occupational</u> Safety and Health, the bulletin identifies serious health hazards related to work in tobacco fields, and steps employers can take to protect the health of farm workers. It also identifies vulnerable workers, including children and adolescents, who may be more sensitive to chemical exposure and more likely to suffer from green tobacco sickness, and who may suffer more serious health consequences than adults. The bulletin is available in English* and Spanish.*



To reduce nicotine exposure among workers, the agencies recommend that employers take the following steps:

- Provide appropriate personal protective equipment to workers. Train workers on the proper use of adequate PPE.
- Make sure workers can recognize GTS signs and symptoms, such as nausea and vomiting. Train supervisors to recognize GTS symptoms in employees and to ensure sick employees drink
- water, rest in shade and receive medical attention if necessary. "The best way to protect people from on-the-job hazards is to prevent those hazards in the first place,

and this bulletin outlines commonsense steps to reduce nicotine exposure and prevent heat illness," Secretary of Labor Thomas Perez said in a press release. "It's important that we continue to work with a wide array of stakeholders in order to find solutions that protect all workers."
