Things to Remember:

- It is VOLUNTARY. It is YOUR decision.
- Year 1 Applications and Year 2 Renewals must be submitted by April 15
- If you became a GAPC Certified Grower in 2018, you are required to submit a 2019 renewal application by April 15 to maintain your GAPC Certification
- Deadline for growers to contact approved auditing firm for best pricing is April 15
- Review the GAPC Certification Compliance Guide and List of Non-Remediable, Critical Certification Standards before deciding to apply. View here.
- All growers listed on the application must complete annual GAP Training by June 30. View calendar of training HERE.

OSHA: Quicktakes

Employers Must Post 2018 Injury/Illness Summary Beginning Feb. 1

Employers are reminded of their obligation to post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes jobrelated injuries and illnesses logged during 2018. Each year, from Feb. 1 to April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements.
