

**Keeping Workers Safe in the Heat** 

Millions of U.S. workers are exposed to heat in their workplaces. Although illness from exposure to heat is preventable, every year, thousands become sick from occupational heat exposure, and some cases are fatal.

Water. Rest. Shade.

Employers and workers should be educated on the dangers of working in the heat. Occupational risk factors for heat illness include heavy physical activity, warm or hot environmental conditions, lack of acclimatization, and wearing clothing that holds

The safety message comes down to three key words: Water. Rest. Shade. Under OSHA law, employers are responsible for providing workplaces free of known safety hazards. This includes protecting

 Provide workers with water, rest, and shade. · Allow new or returning workers to gradually increase workloads and take more frequent breaks as they acclimatize or

Lack of acclimatization represents a major risk factor for fatal outcomes.

Most outdoor fatalities, 50% to 70%, occur in the first few days of working in warm or hot environments because the body needs to build a tolerance to the heat gradually over time. The process of building tolerance is called heat acclimatization.
