How GAPC Certification Relates to Sustainable Tobacco Program (STP)

New for 2022 is the requirement for all growers participating in the Certification Program to complete the Self-Assessment.

agricultural supply chains, basically a "GAP program" focused on sustainability for tobacco buyers and their respective global grower bases. Who is Involved?

The tobacco companies involved in STP include Altria Client Services, British American Tobacco, Imperial Tobacco, JT International, RJ Reynolds Tobacco and Swedish Match and any company that may supply to one of these manufacturers

You may have heard about "STP" at a GAP training or a company meeting but may still have questions about what it is and how it affects you as a grower. "STP" stands for the Sustainable Tobacco Program. STP is a program for sustainable

including but not limited to Universal North America, Alliance One, United Tobacco Company, Hail and Cotton Inc., and Gallatin Redrying and Storage. What does the program focus on? The program focuses on the impacts on sustainability within their global supply chain – the environment, the farmers,

workers, their families, and the broader communities in which tobacco is grown – within eight topics: Water, Human & labor rights, Crop, Soil health, Climate change, Natural habitats, Livelihoods, and Governance. This is similar to the mission and

focus of GAPC and the GAPC Certification Program sections of Crop, Environment and Labor Management.

What is the Sustainable Tobacco Program (STP)?

What do companies involved in the STP have to do? • Be aware of risks, challenges and opportunities in their supply chain and make clear what they are doing, or going to do, to address them. Complete a self-assessment answering questions and reporting information on behalf of their company. Responses to the self-assessment are validated based on shared information and evidence.

The STP's most obvious effect on growers is the additional requests for information from companies involved in STP. They may collect this information at contract signing, during farm visits, with surveys, and/or at delivery. In addition to collecting farm

companies, and the industry as GAPC Certification not only encourages and recognizes the adoption of best agricultural practices but also increases the ease in reporting to other platforms that help bring attention to the efforts of U.S. tobacco

It is our goal that GAPC Certification can help supply the needed data through application, self-assessment, and monitoring visit data. The more aligned the GAPC Certification data collection efforts are with STP data needs the less participating companies may ask and visit growers to collect information. GAPC monitoring data is also verified by a third-party audit firm which increases the credibility of the data supplied. GAPC sees this efficient data collection as a "win-win" for growers,

How does GAPC Certification Program help companies (and their growers) involved in STP?

Monitor farms to identify actual or potential adverse sustainability impacts or challenges.
